This air quality campaign is organised by GLOBE Ireland, an affiliate of NASA, and many schools across Ireland are taking part in the campaign.




Polar Exploration Comes to Dalkey

This week, our Transition Year students were treated to a truly memorable and fascinating talk from world record-holding polar traveller and author **Alex Hibbert**, who visited Dalkey from London to speak to our TYs about everything from endurance to Eskimos.

Alex has skied further on an unsupported Arctic journey than anyone in history, and is one of only 11 people to have broken the polar unsupported 1,000-mile barrier.

In July 2008, Alex completed his 1,374-mile, 113-day 'Long Haul' return crossing of a new ice sheet route, along with team-mate George Bullard. They received no resupplies or physical support and completed the final week on almost no food.

Highly active in the polar and cold regions, Alex has led independent projects for well over a decade. Journeys since the Long Haul journey have included a high-speed icecap crossing (330 miles in less than 12 days) and routes in Svalbard, the Alaskan North Slope, High Arctic Canada and nearly half a year living with the Polar Eskimos.
