

Triathlete **Mary O'Donnell** from Fermoy, County Cork graduated in 2024 with a Masters in Aeronautical Engineering from University of Limerick.

Mary spoke with the TYs about her STEM journey (including being the only girl to do Applied Maths in her Leaving Cert class), her career in the field of aerodynamics, her advocacy for more women in both STEM careers and the sporting world, the importance of following your passion, completing as a long distance triathlete, and the power of perseverance.
